



Student Use of Elkins Park Campus Facility during the Fall 2020 Semester FAQs

1. When is the Elkins Park campus open?

Monday to Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Saturday and Sunday, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
2. Where can I study?

The Learning Resource Center (LRC), Classroom W111 (adjacent to the LRC) and the Bennett Lounge and second floor student lounge in the Hafter Student and Community Center (HSCC) have been set up for physically distanced studying purposes. The coffee machines in the LRC have been removed and there is no eating in the LRC or supplemental study spaces. Masks must be worn at all times.
3. Is printing available?

Yes, in the LRC.
4. Will food service be available while I'm on campus?

Yes. The café is open. Single seat tables are available for use both in the dining area and under an outdoor tent that has been set up adjacent to the South first floor elevator lobby. Please note that the café is cashless. At the café kiosks, you may load funds (using your credit card) on to your Salus ID card for future use. For every \$100 loaded, you will receive \$105. You may also use your credit card to purchase food.
5. Will I be able to exercise on campus?

Yes. The fitness center spaces have been de-densified and may be used by appointment only - 15 appointments per hour – Monday to Friday, 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Three (men's) and three (women's) shower/locker appointments per hour will also be available. Appointments can be made at <https://salus.ptminder.com>. Per current Pennsylvania guidelines, masks must be worn while exercising.
6. Will the bookstore be open?

Yes. The bookstore is currently open Monday to Thursday, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
7. Will I be able to access my locker to store my personal belongings while I am on campus?

No. Because of physical distancing requirements you will not be able to access your locker. If you need to retrieve something from your locker that was left on campus prior to the pandemic, please contact Student Affairs who can arrange one-time access. Locker access is being considered for the cold months.
8. What about student events?

Student events are limited to 25 persons indoors and 250 persons outdoors. They must be arranged by student council in connection with Student Affairs and Facilities.
