

COVID-19 Screening Criteria
For Entrance into Salus University Facilities

In order to protect the Salus University staff, faculty, students, patients, clients and visitors, everyone who enters a Salus University facility must have their temperature taken and answer the questions below.

Anyone with a fever of 100.4^o or higher will not be allowed to enter.

Anyone answering "yes" to **ONE** or more of these questions will not be allowed to enter.

- Do you have a cough?
- Do you have shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
- Have you been exposed* to someone diagnosed with COVID-19 in the past two weeks?

*According to CDC guidance, exposure does not include close contact with an individual with COVID-19 in a healthcare setting by a student or faculty member who was wearing the recommended PPE.

Anyone answering "yes" to **TWO** or more of these questions will not be allowed to enter.

- Do you have chills?
- Are you experiencing repeated shaking with chills?
- Do you have muscle pain?
- Do you have a headache?
- Do you have a sore throat?
- Do you have diarrhea or other gastrointestinal tract issues?
- Have you recently experienced a loss of taste or smell?
- Does anyone in your household have one or more of these symptoms? (If anyone in your household has **TWO** or more symptoms, then you will not be allowed to enter.)

Anyone who is refused entrance to a Salus facility based on their responses to this questionnaire is to be directed to follow the guidance of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and to contact their health care provider.

Salus staff or faculty who are refused entrance are to contact their supervisor. Salus students who are refused entrance are to contact their program.
